Taught grades K-5 at two elementary schools. Developed and taught lessons based on the Colorado State Standards that incorporated differentiation, literacy, numeracy, and art skills. Managed classes on average with 22 students. Art skills included mural art, drawing, found object sculptures, collage, claymation, digital drawing, slab building, and painting. Formative and summative assessments utilized through critiques and artist statements. Also involved with literacy nights, student exhibitions, creating props for the musical, and staff art nights.
