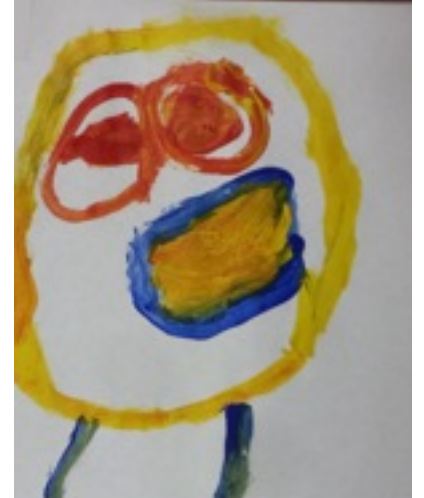


STORIES OF SELF EXPRESSION

Through the use of oil pastels, paints, pipe cleaners, found objects and clay the students got kinetic when creating active and exciting works of art that reflected their joyful personalities.

Identify that art represents and tells the stories of people, places, or things.

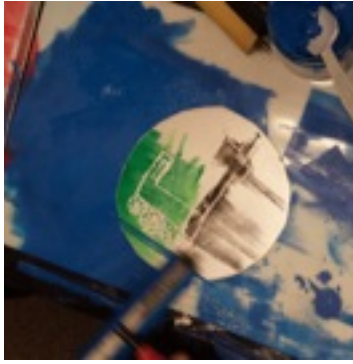
3.1- Invent and Discover to Create:

Learning Self Expression

Through reflecting on their memories of times that made them happy or sad, the students created imaginary and whimsical artwork that allowed them to travel in their mind, to places that they wish existed.

What's Your Story?

What if you could be the inventor of a world made entirely out of your favorite food? If you were able to travel in any way you wanted, what mode of transportation would YOU invent?

The students were able to expand on their own personal interests through invention and create artist trading cards based on these interests to express themselves and connect to their peers.



Art in Motion

Stop! Go! Stop! Go! In these lessons, the energetic students were able to investigate the ways in which they are active and how art can evoke a sense of movement when portraying a person. Using energetic brush strokes to capture their friends in the midst of moving, or making new forms of transportation that float in space, students learned how to transfer motion into visual language.
